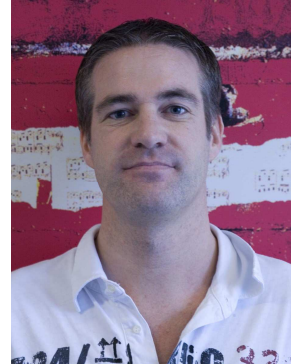


Asysco adds more new employees

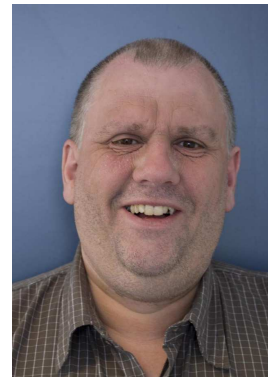
Gertjan Lahuis – Tailor-made Software Engineer
