Moreover, she has many professional qualifications in the field of testing, such as TMap, ISEB Foundation and ISEB Practitioner.



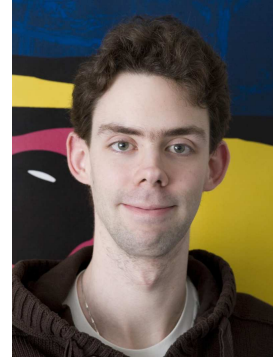
Henry Morren – R&D Software Engineer
